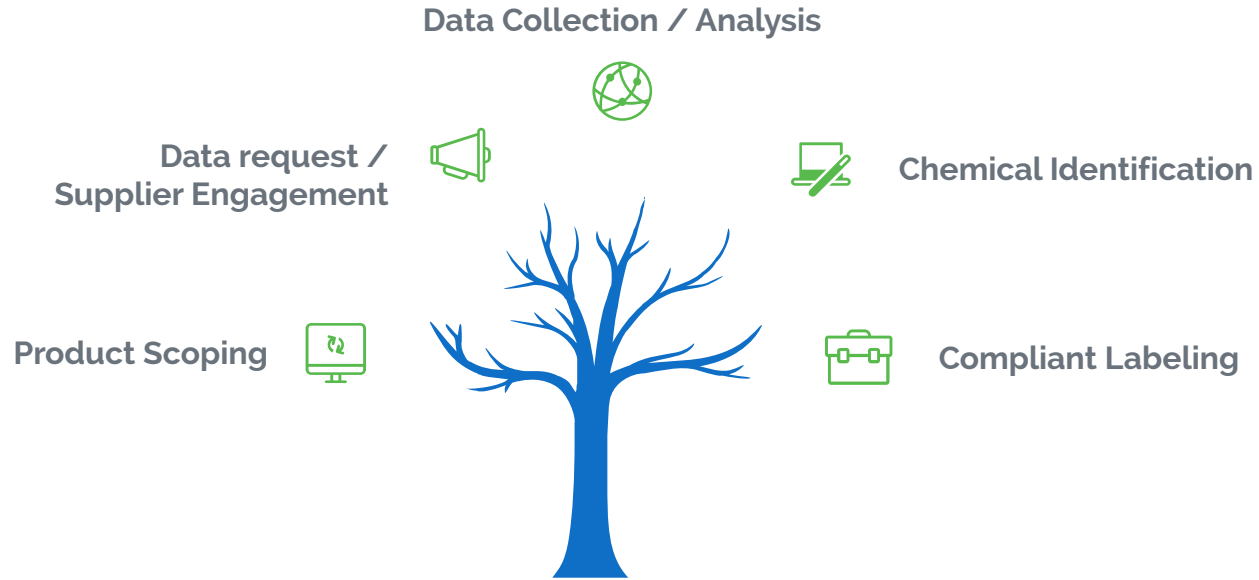

PHASE ONE

Put together the complete component make-up of your product

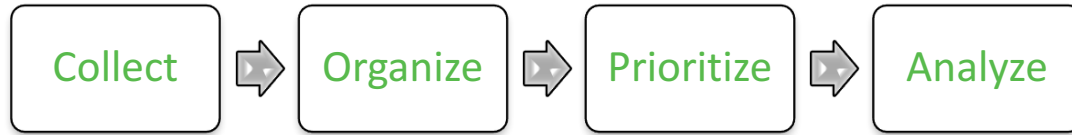
- Risk driven approach
- Goal is to include or eliminate certain products from your Prop 65 compliance process



SECOND PHASE

Empower your suppliers to give you the data you need to continue your Prop 65 compliance process

- International supply chains have language/geographical communication challenges
- Supplier education

 - Guiding documentation on Prop 65 regulation technicalities.



Be prepared for variation in data and responses

- Organize data with product/component tagging
- Prioritize Prop 65 compliance process based on product/component flagging

Time for the data deep dive

- Gather multiple tiers of supplier product data to understand complete chemical make up
- Run chemicals against Prop 65 list and prioritize testing for safe harbor level thresholds
